4. MINUTES of MARCH GENERAL MEETING

Ed welcomed all to the March meeting.

Apologies: Jennifer Lock, Bob Southwell, Bruce Hall, Di Blay, Bronwen Fox & Ruth Scott.

Visitor: Hazel.

Edward Welcomed Neville Anderson as a new member and presented him with an orchid and our Society's new information pamphlet. It was really welcoming him back since Neville first attended a Coffs Harbour meeting in the early 1960's. Everyone was then given the new members pamphlet as there was updated information in it.

We were all encouraged to bring along our flowering orchids, and to be generous with any information we to help each other grow better plants. Helping each other should be an integral part of belonging to our club. Ed then presented every member with a Dendrobium kingianum

"Ron's Gift". It was the first orchid Ed's father gave him when he started growing orchids. Ed then introduced Brian Moore who was to be our guest speaker later in the evening.

- 1. We were reminded about the Orchid Appreciation Workshop in Kempsey and the importance of getting "new blood" into the judging circles of the Mid North Coast. Full details were in the February newsletter.

Popular Orchid: Equal first prize to Helen Siever (Dendrobium) & John Sidebottom (Dendrobium). It was the second month running that John's plant was awarded first prize.

Ed did a table talk, highlighting a small Cattleya belonging to Helen Siever, a "Cooktown" orchid with many flowers on it and a Galeopetalum. He pointed out the compact nature of the plants and that big doesn't always mean better or more spectacular.

Brian Moore's talk will appear in a later newsletter.

5. BRIAN MOORE'S TALK

Brian moved to the mid north coast 50 years ago and has been growing orchids at various locations

in the area. He has spent the last 15 years at Dorrigo at an altitude of 3000 feet. The growing conditions have been quite different from our coastal strip.

A Native Orchid Mix.

2 parts 12mm bark (sieved to remove fixers), 1 part 10-12mm scoria or other aggregate, also jumbo perlite approx. 20% of the above mixture. The main thing is that good drainage be maintained over a period of 2 years or more. This mix would be suitable for many other genera including Cymbidiums.

Recently "Orchiata" Bark has become available through the Orchid Societies. "Bio Grow" bark is available to members of NVOS through Max McKay. "Orchid Mate" coco chip is available from Ray Clements at Tinonee Orchid Nursery.

Potting Time:

Brian breaks up & pots on during Sept/Oct – this is good for Cymbidiums and natives, he likes natives to have new growth of at least 2 inches when he does it.

Brian's collection of cool growing orchids includes Odontoglossum hybrids, Coelogyne, Dendrochilum, Masdevallia, Cymbidiums & Native Dendrobiums. These all grow well on the Dorrigo Plateau.

Orchids that don't do well up in Dorrigo but do very well around the coastal strip are Cattleyas, Miltoniopsis, Phalaenopsis, Oncidiums, Brassias, Tropical Dendrobiums including Indian Dendrobiums.

Pests.

Scale starts to move when the weather gets warmer, September onwards. Woolly aphids – hard to eradicate once established. Hot days, airless conditions conducive to this pest. It is said that if you can see it above the surface of the potting mix it is probably in the roots too. Isolate the infected plants and spray with Rogor morning & evening. (Not in the heat of the day) Use rubber gloves and a face mask.

"Rogor" is an organic phosphate and care is needed in its use. It is now called "Super Way" – "Dimethoate 300" systemic insecticide. It is also effective against Dendrobium Beetle, Brown & White Scale, & green and black aphids. 1 teaspoon in a 1 litre of water in a dedicated spray bottle, is always handy to have on hand.

Staking Spikes.

This job is best carried out early and it will be necessary to retie the spike as it matures. With Cymbidiums extra shading for greens and whites will improve the colouring of the blooms. Extra light will improve pinks, yellows and reds.

Sphagnum Moss.

Excellent for back cuts, back bulbs, small plants etc. Best watered with tank water when possible – no feeding using fertilisers.

Brian has been using rainwater for years and aims for a pH of as close to neutral 7.0. Popular fertilisers "Campbells Yellow" & Yates "Flower and Fruit" are used at quarter strength and only once a month. Soluble fertilisers — Nitrosol, Seasol, Powerfeed, again at quarter strength fortnightly. Dry feed — Dynamic Lifter, Superphosphate, blood & bone a small amount

around the top of pots of Cymbidiums, Zygopetalums approx. every 6 weeks.

Cutting tools need to be sterilized after each cut. Brian uses "Sterri Kleen" at rate of 10 grams per 200 ml of water.

Recent heatwave conditions – Brian added extra shade to the roof of his shade house it will come off in April as it gets cooler.

Rot.

Once rot gets into the roots of plants especially Cymbidiums it can travel up to the new leads. Remove plant trim back dead roots, bulbs & leads, wash and dry the plant out. Using "Scott's Ban Rot" or "Yates Phis Acid" Soak plant in a bucket of prepared fungicide for 15 – 20 minutes. Dry out and leave plant a week or so before repotting in a course free draining mixture. Plants infected with fungus should be isolated. Bringing back from a fungus attack can be a long road.

6. COMMITTEE REPORT

Committee met as usual on the Tuesday after our general meeting. Main matters dicussed were –

- Steve Clemesha Trophy
- Ordering of bark
- Need to properly document our "house rules"/standard processes.

7. APRIL SHOW

How are your orchids going? What plants might you have in flower for our April Show? What do you need to do to them to present them at their best? We encourage everyone to enter the plants they have in flower so that we can put on a good display for the public.

8. ERIC COLLINS

We were sad to learn of the death of Eric Collins recently. Eric and his wife Dot were members of our society for many years although we didn't see much of him for the last few years due to his ill health.

9. MEMBERSHIP FEES

Please note that the annual memberships have been due since the February meeting. The fees are the

same as for 2017, i.e. \$5 for a junior membership, \$10 for a single membership and \$15 for a couple (New members who paid towards the end of last year don't need to pay for 2018). Please pay Bruce Hall as soon as possible.

This Growing Competition ends at the April meeting and the winners will be announced and prizes presented at the May meeting. Prizes presented for the grower with the most points accumulated during the year and the grower to be the first to achieve flowering status.

This new competition will commence in May, 2018 and conclude in April, 2019. This year's growing competition plant is Blc. Little Mermaid 'Janet' and plants will be allocated during the April meeting. Cost is \$10 per plant.

The plant draw will be based on the order of payment and each person will draw out a numbered ticket and this will be the number of the plant you will receive.

Please pay Bruce Hall your \$10 before the start of the meeting. If you won't be at the meeting and would like a plant, then please ring Ed (0418 519 908) or Bob (0417 695 8340) before the meeting.

This is an easy to grow plant and members of this group should be in everyone's orchid collection.
