Table Talk. - Ed drew our attention to 3 of the benched orchids, Laelia anceps; Coelogyne mooreana; and Coelogyne Jannine Banks.

General Business.

- 1. We were reminded that the Society has 90 bags of bark for sale at \$25 for 40 litres and also charcoal in various sizes.
- 2. On July 14th we are once again off to Tinonee Orchids for their annual open day. Paperwork was passed around for members to sign up for the trip. The cost will probably be around \$20 as it has been in the past. This is an opportunity for members to listen to experts talk about various aspects of orchid growing and culture as well as buying plants they have been looking out for. We are limited to 20 on the bus including the driver and it appears from the interest expressed that the bus is quickly filling. We may have to look at some carpooling to accommodate everyone.

Last year's competition plant was Zygopetalum Debbie De Mellow "Honolulu Bay" and the winner of "First flowering plant" was Ed Pearce. Ed also took out 1st prize in the growing comp with 20 points, and Trevor Bissett runner up with 17 points. Congratulations to them both.

5. **GUEST SPEAKER – ZYGOPETALUMS.**

Ed had a PowerPoint presentation

- 1. Talked a little about the early days of orchid collecting and growing.
- 2. Discovery of several Zygopetalum species in Brazil
- 3. Early efforts at hybridizing and a few intergeneric hybrids which in his opinion may not really have been true intergeneric hybrids since most of them seemed to be just Zygopetalums.
- 4. About 30 years ago Hamelwellsara was created as an intergeneric hybrid of 5 genera.
- 5. We now have some much improved Zygopetalums, and a range of intergeneric hybrids offering a range of colours and spiking habits.
- 6. Zygopetalums grow fairly well in our area. They need a fairly free draining mix and need lots of water in the growing season
- 7. Many of them are very susceptible to black spots on the leaves caused by fungus. This can be reduced by good air movement and keeping them drier in colder weather.
- 8. They can also have mealy bug so spraying and air movement can help with this.

11. ORCHID BARK

The Society has combined with Woolgoolga Orchid Society and purchased a supply of 40L bags of Orchiata Bark for sale to members.

Two sizes are available: 9 to 12mm and 12 to 18mm. These are value priced at \$25 per bag.

Orchiata is a NZ pine bark which had been sterilized and had dolomite added to stabilise the pH of the bark. This is a high-quality potting bark which under normal growing conditions has a life of at least two years. The bags are stored at Bob Southwell's house (6 Sunrise Drive, Boambee East) and can be obtained by contacting Bob on 0417 695834 or email bssouthwell@bigpond.com (or any other Committee member and they will pass the order on). Either you pick them up or Bob will try to deliver to your house or at the next monthly meeting.
