Minutes of July's meeting: Moved by Brenda Mayled, seconded by Helen Seiver that the Minutes are a true and accurate record of what took place. Carried.

Finance: Bruce reported incoming money of \$128 from membership and raffle sales; outgoing expenses were \$62 – Copy centre and petty cash. The report was moved by Bob Southwell and seconded by Sue Williams. Carried.

Table Talk: Bob Southwell started the table talksaying that Cymbidiums especially the cascading andminiature varieties are starting to make a real showlocally. The Vandaceous / Aerides are beginning tomake a good show, Ed's Lycaste was impressive, andhe said it has been flowering since February. We alladmired Betty's Androecium commonly referred toas Darwin's Orchid. Neville Anderson picked upSilesa's Dendrochilum saying they are perfect plantsfor our Coffs climate.

Sponsor's Spot: Tinonee Orchids. Ed said that those who went to Tinonee the previous weekend were exposed to some wonderful speakers and huge display of plants for sale.

Library: Carole displayed a good selection of books. She is in the process of buying some new books the first being on Coelogynes.

General Business:

Spring Show. Ed said there would be only 1 more meeting before our Spring Show. He hoped we are all paying attention to our orchids to put on a spectacular display for the public. He said it's important to bring along any orchid in flower, there may be a section champion sitting there on your bench at home.

Auction.

The auction got under way with 26 orchids and 1 book up for offer. Some of the orchids had some very impressive history, when names like Brian Moore, David Banks, Steve Clemesha and Edward Pearce are linked to them. There was some competitive bidding and at the end of the night \$503 had changed hands. A pretty impressive amount.

The meeting finished up at about 8.40 pm followed by a light supper.

5. MONTHLY ORCHID DISPLAY

Members are asked to make sure they write their names on the back of the competition label. No name will result in no points being allocated.

It is also important to make sure you bench your plant in the correct category and write the class number on the competition label. The class number is displayed on the plastic label on the bench. If you are not sure where the plant goes then please ask one of the Committee for help.

If you want to make life easier and write out your competition labels before the meeting then

you can download a sheet of labels from the Society website (<u>www.coffsorchidsociety.org.au</u>)

(Once at the website go to dropdown menu item' About' and then click on 'Forms').

There is also a list of all the competition category numbers in the 'Forms' section of the website. This will help you fill in the correct class for each orchid.

6. NATIVE PLANT SELLING LICENCE

The Society has obtained a licence to sell NSW Native Orchids to the public. This only covers orchids which have been grown in a plantation (greenhouse) environment and not taken directly from the wild. All CHOS financial members will be covered by this licence if they wish to sell NSW Native Orchids. This includes NSW Species orchids and hybrids in which one or more of the parents have origins from NSW.

Plants will need to be tagged (sticky label on the pot or mount) and details recorded on the form provided by the Society. The Society will provide the tag labels for each pot. Please talk to Bob Southwell (0417695834) if you would like to sell NSW Natives at our Spring Show.

7. GROWING COMPETITION

Good to see at the August meeting that large numbers of competition plants continue to show new flower spikes and many are now in full flower with nice displays.

Don't forget to bring your competition plant for judging at the September meeting. Remember each time you bring the plant you receive a point towards your total point score.

10. ALAN MERRIMAN'S ADVICE

When Alan gave his talk at Woolgoolga on 25 June he took home 2 pot-sized lots of bark and several cymbidium leaves for further analysis. A number of people also gave Miriam Merriman their email addresses so they could receive his monthly newsletter.

Alan has notified Dick Cooper that both lots of bark proved in need of a good dose of lime - he found they both had extra low pH readings which had caused the root problems; the Cymbidium leaves all showed signs of severe two-spotted mite infestation. For those people who wanted to receive his monthly newsletter and had provided 'bigpond' email addresses, Alan asked if could contact they him at mirannorchids@pnc.com.au because he was having difficulties connecting with those emails.

Alan is returning to Arrawarra for 1 week in late October and is happy to bring any chemicals (if he can obtain them) and his own fertilizers and chemicals for anyone who wants to place an order. Stock items include -

- Merrifert (1 kg container);
- Merricote (1 kg container);
- Auxinone (root hormone stimulant) (500 ml container);
- Zeolites (1 kg container); and
- MerriKleen (a tool sanitizer).
