1. EDITORIAL:

By the time you are reading this article it will only be three to four weeks until the Spring Show and so it is timely to start addressing how you can prepare your plants to ensure they look fabulous on the show bench.

The following tips will all contribute to producing a well presented plant that will look good to the general viewer and take the eye of the Judges.

- Proper cultural techniques, watering, adequate nutrition, good disease and pest control, etc, will result in healthy, actively growing plants which will always look great on the show bench.
- Early staking is important to ensure that flowers develop with correct orientation and present well to the Judges. You can use clips in the early stages but it may be better to replace these with ties prior to the show. Often an arching inflorescence presents better than an upright one.
- Follow the basic staking rules including how to tie a branching inflorescence. Do not tie or clip any part of the ovary of the flower.
 Make sure that stakes are cut short so they don't cause eye damage, etc.
- Remove any additional travelling ties so the orchid presents well.
 Sometimes removal of hanging hooks gives the orchid a cleaner look.
- Prior to the Show, clean up the plant. Remove old flower stalks, dead leaves, etc. Cleaning the leaves (metho, etc) may help in presenting a nice-looking plant.
- Remove any signs of disease and pests. For example, a small amount of scale can be removed with a cotton bud dipped in metho. Please don't bring diseased plants to the Show. The Show Marshal will remove them as they may endanger plants of other growers. Please do not bench any plants that harbour ants as these can transfer diseases from one plant to another and could indicate that your plant contains insect pests which attract the ants.
- Each pot or mount needs proper support. Don't expect the Show
 Marshal to do it for you. Plants that are not self-supporting may be
 removed from the exhibition as they can fall over and damage other
 entries. (Continued on Page 3)



- Use a larger pot, pot feet, etc, to make sure the plant is stable. Proper stands or upside-down pots may help to elevate the plants.
- Clear labels for each plant are desirable. If the name is not known, then say Unknown on the label (Eg: Dendrobium Unknown or NoID). It sometimes helps to look up the orchids name to check that it is spelt correctly. A proper label assists in deciding if the orchid is a species or a hybrid. 4B, 5B and 6B pencils can be used to make a long-lasting label. A permanent marker also does the job.
- Water the plant the day before benching or early in the morning if benching late in the day.
 The plant needs to survive without water for three days but it is important to avoid pools of water on the show bench from freshly watered pots. Avoid wetting the flower petals as this may cause spots, etc.
- Once you register your plant with the Show Officials you will be given a white card and a number for each plant. Write your name on the back of the card. Place the numbered dot on the front of the card in the right-hand corner above the line. Write the name of the plant on the front of the card below the line. Use the double-sided tape dispenser to stick the card onto the side of the pot you want facing the Judges. Make sure you pick the side which best displays your flowering orchid.
- Tables will be provided outside the Show Room so you can unpack and label your plants before benching.
- When ready, place your plants on the inside receiving table or hand to an official at that table. The official will then place the plant in the correct place on the bench. Please do not bench the plant yourself. If you have a large specimen plant then please talk to the Show Marshal who may then direct you as to where to place it to save double handling.

Just prior to the Show you need to check the Show Schedule and determine if there is a category into which your plant will fit. Most importantly you need to read the Rules and Conditions that apply to this Show and make sure that you comply with them. Happy Growing and Competing!




14. Coffs Harbour Orchid Society Facebook: By Paige Sinclair

16. FEATURE ARTICLE—TAKING ORCHID PHOTOS 101 WITH YOUR SMART PHONE


A summary of a presentation given to CHOS by Paige Sinclair

Ten steps to taking better photographs using a Smart Phone:

1.Start with a clean lens.

Use alcohol wipes or a micro-fiber cloth to clean your lens.

2. Composing your shots.



On multi floral shots use the rule of thirds. The grid on your camera can help you do this.

On single blooms use the middle box to centre your flower.


(If you don't have a grid on your phone you can set it up for iOS, visit Settings and select Camera. From there, enable "Grid" to deploy a rule-of-thirds overlay in the Camera app. That grid will help you better compose your image, and keep your shot parallel with any vertical or horizontal lines in your shot. On Android devices, visit Settings > Apps > Camera, and select "Grid Lines" to choose between a rule-of-thirds overlay or a square overlay.)

Make sure you're not capturing any unwanted subjects while you shoot.

"Composition, composition, composition!" It's so important. So, take your time!!

3. Focus is important!

Today's phone cameras automatically focus on the foreground of your frame, but not every picture you take on your phone has an obvious subject. To adjust where you want your camera lens to focus, tap the screen where you want to sharpen the view.

4. Embrace negative space.

'Negative space' simply refers to the areas around and between the subjects of an image
— and It can take a photo from "good" to "great."

When you include a lot of empty space in a photo, your subject will stand out more and evoke a stronger reaction from your viewer.

And what does negative space look like? It's often a large expanse of open sky, an empty field, a large wall, or water or perhaps a black background.

5. Neutral background.

I personally prefer a matt black, and use black velvet at home, but any black fabric that has a dull or matt finish will do the trick, or you can paint a wall a neutral colour for your backdrop —but be careful on your colour choice as this may change the overall colour taken by the device. For our orchid shows I use a matt black fabric I bought at Spotlight and keep it rolled up to minimise wrinkles.

6. Resist using the 'Digital' zoom!

On a smart phone, especially if you'd love to get a closer look at the orchid's sexy bits, please only use the zoom feature sparingly. Digital zoom shots are simply cropped and resized images, unlike the optical zoom functionality you might find on a full-blown camera. Digital zoom will not only yield a grainy image, it will reduce the resolution of the overall photo and intensify any vibrations from your hands, leaving you with an inferior photo of that stunning orchid. If your camera has multiple camera lenses, like some the new smart phones these days, have a play.

7. It's all about the light!

Look for available light before making your own. Avoid the flash of an LED light from your smartphone, it doesn't flatter anything, no matter what subject you're trying to capture. And that glaring light coming from a single source will more often than not give your images a harsh, odd-coloured look compared to light being diffused from one or multiple sources. Especially indoor lighting.

The best source of light is the sun, and it can be dappled sunlight or even on an overcast day. Amazingly, todays smartphones actually take great photos even in dull indoor light like this room. Second best choice is to use two white light LED lamps placed 45 degrees from your subject.

8. Steady yourself!

If you're a bit shaky or cannot hold a stance for a long period of time while you are framing your shot, then buy a small tripod, or use a solid object to rest your hands, elbows, or shoulder on.

9. Don't be afraid to edit!

Composing and taking your smartphone photo is just the first step to making it visually compelling. Editing your photos is the next step — and a very critical one, at that. There are many great photo and video editing apps out there for mobile devices. But the one on your camera is usually sufficient.

10. Practice

Today, if you were to apply to get your drivers license – you would need to log 120 hours of actually driving a vehicle. If you took photos for that length of time, you would start to understand the basic principles of taking better images.

Practice makes perfect!
